

INTRODUCTION

The PhD programme in Clinical Psychology is a professional degree based on the scientist-practitioner model set forth by the Boulder conference on Graduate Education in Clinical Psychology. The programme integrates the clinical, academic, and research components of clinical psychology into a coherent training experience that prepares students for careers as clinical psychologists. Students are prepared for independent practice as clinicians, researchers and academics.

In addition to providing students with a high quality training experience, the PhD Clinical Psychology programme is designed to comply with the current legislation for professional psychologists in Cyprus and comply with the requirements for the EuroPsy as set by the European Federation of Psychologists Associations (EFPA).

WHO IS THE PROGRAMME FOR

The PhD programme is for individuals holding a Bachelor's degree and a Master's degree in psychology and who wish to work as independent practitioners in clinical psychology and as academics and researchers.

PROGRAMME DURATION

The minimum duration of the programme is three years (nine semesters) and the maximum is five years.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

The language of instruction is English.



LEARNING OUTCOMES

The three years of study and training provided by the PhD in Clinical Psychology programme has been carefully designed to ensure that successful students will:

- Learn to critically analyse and synthesise information from evidence based practices in Clinical Psychology using a variety of resources so that their training will constitute the basis for their development as lifelong learners and self-reflective practitioners.
- Develop knowledge and skills in therapeutic relationships as derived from a variety of evidence based psychotherapeutic approaches and which can be effectively applied in varying treatment contexts.

- Develop skills in the selection, application, and interpretation of clinical and psychometric assessment methods as well as being able to assess the efficacy of their clinical practice.
- Develop skills to work with a range of clinical populations
- Develop high ethical standards consistent with future roles as professional and responsible clinicians, and as informed by the ethical codes and standards of the Cyprus Psychologists' Association, the European Federation for Psychologists' Association (EFPA), and the American Psychological Association (APA) Code of Conduct.
- Value and appreciate the diversity represented by individuals of differing cultures, gender, ethnicity, races, religions, ages, physical/ mental status, and other groups.
- Adopt a scientific approach to addressing questions relevant to Clinical Psychology and develop proficiency in organising research protocols and procedures.
- Develop proficiency in presenting scientific data in written and in oral form.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The programme admits students in Fall semesters. Applications for admission to the degree will be considered only from candidates who fulfill the minimum entrance criteria as described below:

- (2) An accredited Master's degree in Psychology
- (3) Completion of prerequisite courses at postgraduate level
- (4) Initial Research Proposal
- (5) Statement of Purpose
- (6) Three Letters of Recommendation
- (7) English Language Proficiency
- (8) Application form
- (9) Individual Interviews
- (10) Previous theses/dissertations and any published work of academic relevance (if any)

PREREQUISITE CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY COURSES

Applicants seeking admission to the PhD programme in Clinical Psychology must have completed the following five courses at the postgraduate level prior to admission to the programme.

Where applicants are not meeting the above requirement, they may complete these courses in the MSc in Clinical Psychology offered by the Department of Social Sciences.
